

Conflict Minerals Policy Statement

Small Parts, Inc. is committed to be a responsible corporate organization and is opposed to human rights abuses. As part of this commitment, Small Parts, Inc. seeks to source products, components and materials from companies that share our values around human rights, ethics and environmental responsibility.

While we as a privately held corporation are not subject to the Conflict Minerals rules and reporting requirements, we understand that our customers may be, and we are committed to help our customers comply with their reporting requirements.

The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission's conflict minerals rule under Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act requires public companies to report annually the presence of conflict minerals (*i.e. Tin, Tungsten, Tantalum and Gold, (i.e. 3TG)*) originating in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, (*DRC*) or adjoining "covered" countries. Our partnership with component and material suppliers is based on agreement and commitment to be socially responsible entities complying with legal and environmental rules and obligations. It is Small Parts, Inc. expectation that all suppliers, direct and indirect, comply with the conflict minerals rule under section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act.
